(Billings, MT, May 2019) – Breakfast Exchange Club of Billings awarded Shelia Wilson and Corrina Gilbertson with Book of Golden Deeds Awards, Friday, May 3, 2019. The Book of Golden Deeds recognizes outstanding men and women who give endless hours of their time and talents, demonstrate an excellent track record of volunteer service and accomplishments, and rarely receive public recognition for their service to others. The club names an honoree each year based on nominations sent in by its membership and from the community. This year the Breakfast Exchange Club chose not one deserving individual but two – these two community volunteers epitomize the very essence of this award.

Sheila Wilson, nominated by Stacy Dreesen, has been the Decorating Committee chair for the Festival of Trees for several years. The Festival of Trees is a major fundraiser for The Family Tree Center. She and her committee volunteer hundreds of hours each year. She coordinated The Family Tree Center's United Way Day of Caring projects for many years. In addition to her service to The Family Tree Center, Sheila marks out the blue ribbon design each year for the Pinwheels for Prevention displays at Metra Park and Courthouse each year. According to Dreesen, The Family Tree Center Executive Director, "Sheila is definitely an unsung hero. Just ask anyone who knows her and she never seeks recognition for all that she does to make our community a better place."

Corrina Gilbertson, nominated by Jasmine Dalrymple, has been a volunteer advocate at CASA of Yellowstone County for two years. She has undergone additional training to serve as a Peer Coordinator, to support other advocates. Through her work with CASA, Corrina advocates for abused and neglected children in the foster care system. She is steadfast and tireless in her advocacy for these children, and serves on their behalf daily. Corrina generously dedicates over 30 hours per month to her advocacy. To date, she has recorded over 140 hours of volunteer time at CASA. In addition to her service to CASA, Corrina volunteers at the YWCA as a SANE volunteer, supporting sexual assault victims. According to Dalrymple, CASA of Yellowstone County Program Coordinator, "Corrina is a fighter, a survivor, and a big believer in being the change. She never refuses a chance to help someone else, and is always the first person to give back."

The Breakfast Exchange Club is one of 630 local clubs with 18,000 members in the United States and Puerto Rico. The group meets every Friday at 7:00 a.m. at the Yellowstone Room – Metra Park. Thank you to the Book of Golden Deeds Committee for putting together such an amazing duo!
