Reading Rocks, a summer reading program in the parks, was a great success in 2018. More than 3,400 books were distributed to children in the Billings community. The Billings Education Foundation would like to thank the many volunteers and sponsors that made this wonderful program possible.

Reading Rocks provides reading activities for six weeks during the summer in conjunction with the School District II's Free Lunch in the Parks, a program that serves over 45,000 free lunches during the course of the summer. Reading Rocks is designed to help low income students continue reading over the summer when reading levels are known to drop. Students can enjoy guest storytellers from around the community at the start of every session. Students are then invited to read with adult and teen volunteers. Finally, all participants select a book of their choice and a prize to take home.

- Tuesdays and Thursdays in Central Park (Central and 10th Street West)
- Tuesdays and Thursdays in Pioneer Park (3rd Street West and Avenue D)
- Wednesdays in Gorham Park (Houle Drive and Miles Avenue)
