Our guest this morning was Suzanne McKiernan with Big Sky Senior Services. She spoke about the impact of Covid on their fundraising, planned events and then just an overall about some of the programs that they promote to the public.

Big Sky Senior Services main mission is to support seniors in the community in living independently. They offer a sliding fee based scale for their support, but mainly help low to middle income seniors. They have two main programs, Seniors holding hands and Prevention of Elder Abuse.

During this time of hardship, they have been relegated to not being able to visit with the seniors they work with just as we have been forced to isolate. Their staff calls over 300 seniors a week to see what is needed and can be provided. In April alone, their staff booked over 82 hours of phone time speaking with seniors and trying to bridge the gap of isolation.

Another program that Suzanen spoke about was a Dementia Friendly America. There are over 21k seniors living in Montana with some form of dementia. There are over 4k living in Billings alone. Suzanne spoke about a lot of learning opportunities for the public on how to interact with seniors that have dementia so that neither side gets too frustrated.
