## **SPEAKER**

Jaidyn spoke about the District level of Exchange and gave a nice presentation on the history of Exchange. She also applauded BEC in its recent beef raffle fundraiser.

For those not in the know:

The first local Exchange Club was founded in 1911 by Charles A. Berkey and was formed in Detroit, MI. The group consisted of business people who wanted to exchange ideas and information with like-minded individuals about how to better serve their communities.

In 1965, three areas of service were adopted by Exchange: American Citizenship, Community Service, and Service to Youth. In 1979, Child Abuse Prevention was adopted as the National Project.

The Vision of Exchange is "A strong America, safe communities, and unified people." Its mission is "Exchange, inspiring communities to become better places to live." The core values of Exchange are "Family, Community, Country" and its motto is "Unity for Service."

There are 12 Districts/Regions of Exchange in the U.S. Montana and Idaho are a part of the Yellowstone District, which consists of 15 clubs. Kalispell and the Rocky collegiate club are the newest clubs in our District. Jaidyn reported that only 4 or 5 of those 15 clubs are currently meeting (so, props to BEC!).


