<u>Speaker</u>

Our speaker today was Marge Hall and Ki from Pooch'z B&B, which is a PERMANENT home for senior dogs. This is a facility to house older dogs that for some reason (ie owners died, went into assisted living, can't care for their pets, abandoned, etc.) needed a new place to live versus going to the pound where BTW, about 60% are ultimately euthanized.

Moving from the people healthcare industry to the canine shelter/rescue non-profit (application in process), Marge and her husband and mom, and some volunteers, have taken in 19 senior dogs to date (15 currently) where they were given a permanent home to eat, sleep, play be cared for and loved by Pooch'z. This is the only facility like this in Billings and when you think about – or don't think about it as the case may be - pets are often overlooked when their owners are no longer able to care for their dogs.

These dogs no doubt receive nothing but good care from Marge – her love for these animals was palpable as she described the stories and personalities of several in her care now including old Ki, who roamed our meeting room collecting love (and bacon) from members until it was time to lay down (in the middle of the room) for nap time. Nap time is a regular part of the dogs day at Pooch'z, in addition

to meals of course, more snacks and their field trips in the backyard of the spacious area where these dogs get to hang out.

This takes a lot of work so volunteers are always welcome, or in-kind donations of dog stuff or just some cold, hard \$\$. They even take-in Chiwawa dogs, which we learned today are one of the breeds least likely to be adopted and most likely to bite (does your dog bite . . . ouch . . . I thought you said your dog doesn't bite . . . that is not my dog – Peter Sellers in the movie Pink Panther – google the scene - hilarious).
