-They have 5 interns that are working towards becoming certified in Therapeutic Recreation.

-Life changing things happen for individuals; yesterday they gave away two bicycles and it is very rewarding and emotional to see these folks happy and getting to participate in a way they maybe never have before.

-They can offer financial aid; they limit the camps to two per person and they ask for 25% to be paid by the family.

Rich thanked the club for all the donations and support the BEC has given over the years. Without the BEC, they couldn't do what they do.
