Horses Spirits Healing, Inc

Horses Spirits Healing is located at the Intermountain Equestrian Center Northwest of the Zimmerman roundabout. They have been accredited in equine therapy since 2016. They started working with Veterans in services, education and research. In 2020 they provided services to \sim 420 individuals and in 2022 they are forecasting 3,400 individuals. MSUB nursing program is now working with them in a psych training program.

Their research program is in conjunction with the Columbia University studying PTSD. Using the equine therapy 8-week program, it has reduced the PTSD markers in some participants. Although the VA does test and assessments of Veterans, there is no VA funding to support this program. The VA claims that it's not evidenced based. So, they are reliant upon help form the community. They are moving toward working with kids with autism.

This is the 3rd year in a row that they have achieve the Best Equine Services in Billings. Amanda Ott leads the services of volunteer organization and said that volunteers are the heartbeat of the program. Speaking of heartbeats, she said that horse can hear a person's heartbeat from 4 feet away. The horses have a way of reacting to a person's anxiety and temperament and amazingly enough it often works vise versa.

They have about a dozen therapy horses and there is no charge to Veterans and their families. They have applied for and received a grant through the VA Adaptive Sports Program, which only covers about 1/3 of their budget. These services are not covered by insurance yet, but the are working on trying to get that changed

They have a multi-use facility, and some people pay to board their horses there and use the facility for training.

With the work they have done with our local Veterans, the Food Truck Battle Committee presented Paul with a check for \$5,100. For more information go to www.horsesspiritshealing.org.
