• Brett Arnold was presented with his membership certificate. He works at PayneWest and is retired US Coastguard. (Thanks for your service!) He is also the upcoming district president for EC. He enjoys giving back and does a lot to support our community.

Program.

Tracy and Chris (and Joey!) gave an overview of Paul Davis. They are a 1-year old business with a focus on full service restoration – recover, reconstruct, and restore. This includes fire mitigation, flooding, and more. Tracy is also a Middle School Teacher and Chris also owns Home Yellowstone.

They franchised with Paul Davis because if the trauma training, customer-first approach, and standardized pricing, as well as relationships with the top 8 insurance companies. One of their main messages was of the importance of knowing where your water main shut off is located. They passed around tags and helpful hints to be prepared for emergencies involving water. They said at least 50% of Americans don't know where their water shut off is located. They suggested putting sensors on your icemaker water line, refrigerator, and dishwasher to alert you if excessive moisture is detected.

One example of the intensity of restoring property is that it took at least 1750 man hours to restore a 2 car garage that was damaged in a fire.
