Speaker:

Our own Shannon Johnson and Tim Stark (Owner of BeSpoke of MT) spoke about the homefront 3D printed home project upcoming in the heights. This 3D home printing project started in 2022, meeting with different entities around Montana concerning the future of 3D home printing in Montana. After a successful outlook, Tim went to the Montana Legislature and got a bill passed allowing 3D home printing in Montana. Some interesting items about 3D printed homes:

A 2000 sq ft home can be 3D printed onsite in about 40 days.

Out of 100 people in construction, 50 are soon to retire... with only 7 people to take their place.

Most 3D home printers require a crane to set up and/or move the 3D printer. Newer printers can virtually set up themselves and are on tracks to enable moving around. The printer that Tim has coming in limited to building 3 stories, and also has a width restriction. Length of the building is not restricted.

Build material is a concrete type product with a GeoPolymer product coming soon which will be lighter in weight.

With 3D printed homes, round walls are not a problem nor an added expense. It's simply a code change telling the printer to print a round wall.

AND, a 3D printed home is generally 30% less money than a stick built home.
