 - 50 food trucks will be there. We had more last year but it was probably too many as some trucks didn't get much action so the Committee capped the trucks at 50 this year.
 - Based on the Facebook interest, it is anticipated that around 7,000 people might show up for this, which is about the same as last year.
 - o Sponsorship \$\$ is solid around \$41K to date.

Reports

- Treasurer Ed reported that we are in pretty good shape in the Operations and Membership Accounts. A good portion of the General Account is the FTB sponsorships. And good news, the Bejot made some money this year! Finally, the Budget Committee has met and the proposed budget will be discussed and considered some more at the September meeting.
- Biz Manager Mike said that our new lower booth may be ready for the upcoming concerts and we may have as many as four booths for these. Through July we are at \$11,644 for the young fiscal year, which is behind last year. And regarding the Fair, well, it hasn't been real good frankly. Maybe this weekend's events will help out.
- Grants Committee Dave gave us a summary of the granting that took place with the \$28K we had to grant, 10% of which goes straight to the Foundation per our bylaws. Grants were given to six of the 14 applicants including:
 - \$5K to Tumbleweed
 - \$7500 to YWCA
 - \$5K for the Education Foundation for the Billings Public Schools
 - \$2K for Kids N Cowboys
 - \$5K for Community Leadership & Development Inc.
 - \$10K for Hoodies for Heroes \$7500 from last year's FTB and \$2,500 committed from this year's FTB

In closing, Dina mentioned that most of the committees don't have Chairs and there are several committees that have no one signed up. So, please take another look at those and see where you can help.
