Announcements.

Guest Speaker – Dan Carter, Par Montana

Dan moved to Billings in the late 80s started with The Gazette. Then he worked at MSUB and eventually Exxon, which is now known as Par Montana.

In June 2023, Par Pacific acquired Exxon and the new name is Par Montana. They went from 80,000 employees globally to 1,800 employees in the US. Locally, they had to rebuild their back end IT, HR, accounting, and community affairs.

Par Montana is a 75-year-old facility in Lockwood. Post-World War 2 era, everybody wanted a car. So the demand for gas was high. They manufacture crude oil into gas, diesel, and jet fuel. Annually, they produce approximately 400 million gallons of gas and 350 million gallons of diesel, equating to approximately 1.4 million gallons per day. The fuel is distributed to terminals in Billings. Bozeman, and Helena via pipeline. There are no Par Pacific gas stations, but Par Montana has a long-term agreement with Exxon to brand their gas. He stated the fact that their fuel is Montana made and brewed. They have 320 employees and 100 contractors.

Par Montana pays approximately 6 million dollars a year in property taxes, which is about 48% of the Lockwood school district's budget.

Their community investment and employees as volunteers is huge. This is their "deliberate activity" to raise awareness of the brand and name and give employee volunteerism to serve as ambassadors. Their priorities for charity funding are the Montana Women's Run, Saturday Live and United Way. They are also big supporters of Lego robotics and stem. Their primary volunteer priority is supporting Reading Pride in partnership with First Interstate Bank for the kids in K-5th in Lockwood.

They are located in Yellowstone County, not in the City of Billings. They have 350 operating acres and 350 green space acres. It's a highly regulated industry. He described the process of how the price at the pump is determined: a combo of economics, taxes, refining costs, distribution and global market demand.
