Program: Gratitude in Action (GIA)

GIA is a non-profit started in 2018. They have several sober living homes. The first and main one is in Chrysalis Acres. They have been there ten years without any problems. Those coming out of addiction issues learn how to take care of themselves, pay their own way and structure.

They have a thrift shop at 10 S. 30th that takes donations of clothing, furniture and general household goods/décor to sell.

They have a Suit Up Program for men who need a suit for a job interview, court appearance, etc.

They also have a Ready to Rent Program for those who do not have a rental history or a bad rental history. A six week course is required. During that time, they are required to pay old debts such as past landlords and the utility companies. The rental agreement is between GIA and the landlord for the first year. GIA goes to the rentals weekly to inspect the first three months and then monthly after that.

A part of the program is also about teaching housekeeping skills.

They advocate for the sober living community with the expectation of change.

Terri did also touch on the State Hospital having purchased land in Billings. They are looking to potentially build a Forensic Unit.

Forensic Unit is where the police take those waiting to stand trial for whatever they were arrested for in order to be deemed able to stand trial or be declared unable to stand trial due to mental illness. There would not be a threat to the community as the person under arrest is taken to the Forensic Unit in a police car and leaves in a police car.

At this time, when someone under arrest needs to be seen at the Forensic Unit, an officer has to escort that individual to and from the state hospital in Warm Springs.

She also discussed the Colonial apartments and the help the residents there have gotten to find a new place to live. She has been in the building and is confident it's the scariest place she's been in. There are hopes of Riverstone being able to purchase the lot and demolish the building to expand their campus.

Terri also let everyone know about a few fundraising events.

The Scarity Haunted House put on by Sean O'Daniel at the Depot the weekends of October 23—25 and October 30—November1. Proceeds go back to local charities.

GIA has the Holiday Affair in early November to raise money for their programs.
