Happy February!

Our guest speaker this morning was Montana State University Billings Chancellor, Stefani Hicswa (and yes, I had to Google the spelling of her name).

Mike Bazemore introduced Chancellor Hicswa. She shared that one of the hardest metrics for colleges is enrollment—both new enrollment and retention—with retention often being the more challenging of the two.

MSU Billings currently has approximately 4,000 enrolled students. About 2,000 are on campus, 1,000 attend the West End campus, and another 1,000 are dual-enrolled in both college and high school. The

university offers many programs both in person and online. Because of this flexibility and strong adult enrollment, the average student age is over 26.

The university employs more than 500 people and offers over 100 different programs, including Colleges of Business; Liberal Arts & Social Sciences; and Health Professionals & Science. MSU Billings began in 1927 as a normal school for teachers. In 1994, it became affiliated with the National Champion Montana State Bobcats. A fun piece of trivia—there have been more graduates since 1994 than prior to 1994. The university also supports 14 sports programs, including cheer and stunt.

MSU Billings is currently working on its strategic plan for the next 100 years. As part of that process, they are engaging with the local workforce to understand future community needs. Planning sessions will be held on Monday, March 30th, and April 6th, and a survey will also be available for input.

One of the university's largest fundraisers is WineFest, taking place April 16th and 17th. Last year, 16 of our club members volunteered to serve at the event. It's a bow tie and white shirt affair—lots of fun, and the food was great. Chancellor Hicswa also mentioned that JazzFest is happening this evening, so if you're looking for something to do, head on down.

MSU Billings is heavily invested in military and veteran programs and even has a dedicated staff office on campus. They also offer several Native American programs. Their medical program is operated through the University of Washington.

That wrapped up the presentation, followed by several questions—including discussion around a potential collegiate club on campus.


One final tidbit: Jeff Roache's wife is currently in Singapore participating in a bell-ringing symphony. Please keep her in your prayers and wish her good luck!
